PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Families

Term 3

Welcome back to all families and staff for the beginning of Term 3. We are all excited to be back and looking forward to a great term of learning.



One of the big events that is happening soon is our **Swimming and Water Safety Program.** We have been fortunate once again to have been successful in obtaining a Sporting Schools grant which has enabled us to reduce the cost from \$100 to \$30 per student. This makes the program very good value for the 5 days of swimming sessions. We hope to see all of our students in Years 1 to 6 taking advantage of this opportunity to gain some swimming and safety skills as well as developing confidence around water. It is unfortunate that we were unable to book Preps in this year due to the lack of availability at the pool.

School Improvements

Our "Yarning Space" has taken shape over the school holidays and would have been completed for the start of term if not for the weather! Once this area in front of the office is completed it will be a very nice area for seating, chatting and playing. It will also make a nice waiting area for parents at the end of the day or even a great outdoor learning space. This development has been made possible through funds raised from our Farm World delivery service along with a Koorie Cultural Understandings grant we were successful in obtaining through the Department of Education.

Supervision and School Attendance Reminder

Our teachers are on duty for supervision from **8.45am each morning until 3.30pm** each afternoon. It is important that students do not attend the school outside of these times. (Bus travellers excepted). **Our Out of School Hours Care service** can be accessed parents who need to have children here outside of those times. Wet Weather—Spare Clothes

During these wet days it would be very helpful if students could have a spare change of uniform with them at school. The grounds have been very muddy and slippery causing quite a few muddy mishaps. Unfortunately we do not always have enough spares on hand to children to change into.

Checking for Understanding – Mini Whiteboards

Mini whiteboards are an effective engagement norm used at Drouin South Primary to assess students' understanding of the material. Lesson slides include specific icons, informing students which engagement norm will be used to gauge their understanding.

What does it look like in action?

After teaching a concept or skill, teachers pose a specific question or assign a task for students to complete. Students then write their answers on their whiteboards.

The phrase "3, 2, 1, chin it" prompts students to hold their whiteboards at their



chins, enabling the teacher to quickly scan and evaluate their responses. This technique allows for an immediate assessment of all students' understanding and provides an opportunity for the teacher to offer instant feedback to address any misconceptions.

By integrating this method into their lessons, teachers ensure active participation and continuous monitoring of student progress.

Duty Times



Teachers are officially on duty from 8.45am each morning before school and until 3.30pm after school. It is important that students only attend school during these supervised hours. The exceptions to the rule are those students who catch the country bus services and students in Out of School Care.




Car Parking

We understand that the school car park areas can become quite busy at the end of the school day. We ask that parents please use the marked spaces at the front of the school OR park at the Drouin South Hall. Please do not park in the bus loop, the staff car park, on the neighbour's property/driveway or across the other side of Westernport Rd. **One way of ensuring a car park space is to arrive 5 to 10 minutes** *after* **the bell.** There is a teacher on gate duty (front and back) until 3.30pm each day. Absence Notifications

Have you received an SMS from our new Absence Notification System?

It is a requirement for all government schools to notify parents on the day that a student is absent.

If we are made aware of the absence prior to the day, we will endeavour to mark the class roll as such so that absence texts will not be automatically generated. Sometimes you may receive a text even though you have notified us. In any case, we ask that you reply to the number with a short explanation or to ring the school to let us know the reason for the absence.
